




Walnut

## ABOUT ME

I retired from the Springfield, Missouri Fire Department in 2017 after 28 years of service. During that time, I was recognized by the Sons of the American Revolution for my work in the community on fire safety.

I have tinkered with woodworking all of my life, so I have made cutting boards, serving trays and a few challenge coin holders. I give them away to people that I know would enjoy them. When I was recognized by the SAR, I gave a challenge coin holder to one of its members for his SAR coins. With the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary coming up, he reached out to see if I would be interested in doing some for the SAR. He also asked about doing some awards plaques made from solid wood. I told him I would be honored to do so.



Although I retired from the fire department, I now work full-time job for the local university. I do woodworking as a hobby for the enjoyment. The wood I use typically comes from old trees that have blown over in windstorms at houses of various friends. I go cut them up and take the logs to a local sawmill. I then let it dry for a couple years, before taking it to a local kiln for drying. I then have an area in my basement where I do my woodworking. I typically use a mineral oil/bees wax finish to leave a natural finish without using any chemicals.



Because most of the wood I use is not commercial lumber, it may have some minor imperfections, but it's grain and color tones will generally be much higher quality. The worm-hole oak is from a tree that had laid on the ground for a couple of years before I took it to the mill. It has phenomenal color tones because of this.
